As concerned residents of Fremont County & the holder of allotment 02224 Natural Lake Grazing Lease, the members of Mountain Range Ranch LLC are opposed to any land tenure adjustments proposed by members of the public in reference to portions of or the entirety of the public lands located in T.33 & 34N., R. 100W. All of this public land should remain as is and managed totally by the federal & state agencies involved. The general public should have total access to & from the public land in question using Bunker Road, which has been ruled a public right of way by the Wyoming Supreme Court. All other alternatives will require the installation of miles & miles of

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of barbed wire fencing on the boundaries between public & private property. At this time fencing is non-existent on all of the property boundaries. Some cross fencing does exist.

Wind turbines should be put on hold, while gas & oil production should be the priority. The demand for gas & oil is increasing at an alarming rate. Also, gas & oil wells are far less conspicuous, once drilling is completed, compared to eye-catching wind turbine farms that stretch for miles across the landscape.
