


**Oil and Gas**

- ◆ Closed on less than 1% of federal mineral estate.
- ◆ Subject to seasonal and placement limitations on 73% of federal mineral estate.
- ◆ 2,274 new oil and gas wells/pads projected.



**Rights-of-Way**

- ◆ Major ROWs avoided on 3% of BLM managed surface and excluded on 9%.
- ◆ 12 miles of designated utility corridors on BLM managed surface.



**Livestock Grazing**

- ◆ Allowed on 97.1% of BLM managed surface. New range infrastructure projects like fences are allowed.


**Dubois Area Management**

- ◆ 13,200 acres are withdrawn from mining and no surface occupancy for oil and gas.
- ◆ Avoided for major ROWs.



# Alternative A Overview

Alternative A, the No Action Alternative, represents the management approach established by the 1987 Lander Field Office RMP and applied for the last 24 years.



**Greater Sage-grouse**

- ◆ Management prohibits development activity near leks on less than 1% of BLM managed surface.

**Special Designations**

- ◆ Areas of critical environmental concern encompass 119,622 acres, or 5% of BLM managed surface.
- ◆ 31 miles of wild and scenic river eligible waterways are managed with interim protection.
- ◆ National historic trails are protected with a ¼-mile buffer on either side of the trails that limit development.



**Recreation**

- ◆ Visitor services focused on protecting resources, mitigating resource use conflict, and protecting human health and safety. 146,717 acres are enhanced for wildlife dependent recreation.



**Travel Management**

- ◆ 0.2% of BLM managed surface (4,639 acres) closed to motorized vehicles.
- ◆ Limitations on motorized travel such as seasonal closures are applied in the majority of the planning area.
