Youth, junior and adults may enter the following classes. Please complete and return the enclosed entry form to the Bureau of Land Management, Scott Fluor, 1335 Main Street, Lander, WY 82520, by August 1, 2014.

Halter Classes: Horses will be judged in three parts:

- 50% - Discipline (willingness, feet handled, move off lead rope, stop, quietness, etc.)
- 25% - Condition (overall balance, body condition using Henneke Method)
- 25% - Handler (how the handler controls and presents the animal)

Lead Line (youth under 8 years): A walk, trot and stop class to include stepping over three poles and leading through an "L" shape. Horse may be shown by adult with child riding (child does not have the ability to ride on their own).

Western Cow Handling (junior and adult classes):* Participant will enter the arena, ride at a walk to the first cone, trot to the second cone, lope to the third cone and to the center of the arena. Rider will ask for a cow (Rider has two minutes to work cow). The rider must handle and pass the cow through the chalk circle. Points will be awarded based on ability to handle the cow.

Green Horse Challenge: Participants will be asked to ride through a gate; cross a bridge; lope and trot both directions; complete a 360 turn inside a box; ride to the judge and back three steps.

Horse must have been adopted between April 1, 2014 and August 15, 2014.

Adult & Junior Free Style Event:* This class can be anything you want it to be. Contestants supply their own props and music if desired. Cattle will be available by advance request on your entry form. Event must last 3-4 minutes. Music is encouraged (Please have music labeled and identified). *No shooting events allowed.*

All Trail Classes To Be Held In The Outdoor Grass Arena

Youth Trail (8 and under): Travel through an "L-shaped" set of poles, forward only; pick up a small flag (from a cone on a barrel) and place it into another cone (on another barrel); walk over poles; open a mailbox, remove mail and show judge; walk across a bridge; dismount and face judge.

Jr. Trail (9-15 years) and In-Hand Trail:* Open a gate; go through an "L-shaped" set of poles, both forward and backward; pick up a small flag (from a cone on a barrel) and place it into another cone (on another barrel); walk between panels; cross a tarp; straddle, then side-pass over a log to open a mailbox, remove mail and show judge; walk across a bridge; dismount and face the judge.

Sr. Trail (16 years +):* Open a gate; pick up a small flag (from a cone on a barrel); back the horse to the next barrel and place the flag into another cone (on another barrel); walk under a tarp and cross a tarp; straddle, then side-pass over a log to open a mailbox, remove mail and show judge; remove slicker from a post, place over your horses neck, then put back on post; walk across a bridge; trot to the trailer; dismount and load your horse into a trailer, unload horse and face judge.

**Overall sweepstakes points will be awarded in each identified class to the rider/horse team.
Horse & Rider must be designated at time of entry.*

Horses must have a current health certificate of inspection prior to arriving at State Fair. All horses must be tested negative for Coggins. Arrangements for horses that need to be stalled must be made with the Wyoming State Fair. The BLM is not responsible for stalling or boarding during the event.
